The College subscribe to the e-journal consortium INFLIBNET – NLIST as well as to a number journals specially in Bengali. The automated bibliographic data-base (ILMS) of the library collections are in progress. A newly built air conditioned reading room equipped with computer and network facilities is operational for the students and the teachers.

22. <u>New books/ Journals subscribed and their values:</u> A total of 330 books were purchased during this session utilizing State Government fund. Annual expenditure to purchase

books during 2016 – 17 was 1 lakh.

23. Cources in which student assessment of teachers is introduced and the

action taken on student feedback: In all the courses student assessment of the teachers is maintained which are analyzed statistically and action taking on such report is continuing.

24. Feedback from Stakeholders

Along with the feedback from the students all the Departments of the College started to meet the guardians at regular intervals and take feedback from them. Their observations and suggestions were taken care off. From 2017 onward feed back from the teachers anfd Alumni members were also started to be taken.

25. Unit cost of Education Unit cost of education during 2016-17 was 0.019461901 lakhs. Total expenditure considered excluding salary amount.

26. Computerization of administration and the process of Admission and examination results, issue of Certificates

The administrative work and internal examination result tabulation are all computerized. On line admission is already operative and from the session 2016-17 the submission of admission fees was upgraded to an online affair along with the application, though the Merit List was, still, generated manually.

27. Increase in the Infrastructural facilities

Budget allocation for infrastructure augmentation excluding salary was Rs. 96,32786/-.Several infrastructural developmental activity was initiated such Beautification of the college campus, computerization of the library, Formation of AC reading room with sufficient space, reorganization of office for better functioning. Many of the office staffs were provided with individual computer.

28. Technology upgradation

Beside teaching practices improved technology was applied in library. Library of the College has a collection of nearly 1,00,000 books. The collge has sunscribed to the e-journal consortium INFLIBNET-NLIST as well as to a number of hard journals specially in Bengali. An automated bibliographic data base of the library collection (ILMS) is in process of being developed. KOHA version 10.2 is being used in ILMS.

29. Computer and internet access and training to teachers, non-teaching staff and Students

Each and every Department are provided with adequate number of Computers with wi-fi connection as per their requirements.

30. Financial aid to students

The Taki Government College is a governmental educational institution whose academic and

allied activities are entirely funded by the Department of Higher Education, Science Technology and Bio-Technology, Govt. of West Bengal. The College is liable to deposit the tution fees collected from the students in the government exchequer through local treasury (in case of Taki Government College, it is Basirhat Treasury). Because of being fully a Government Institution, it cannot take and utilize any fund from any individual or organization to help the student financially. There are a number of scholarships for the students given by the Govt. of West Bengal.

31. Activities and support from Alumni association

The Alumni Association/Chapter of the Taki Government College (functional and in the process of getting registered) have been contributing significantly to the development of the institution

32. Activities and support from the parent-Teacher Association

There is no formal Parents –Teachers' Association in Taki Government College. However, the faculty members of each department conduct the Parent- Teachers' Meeting every year. As per the suggestion by IQAC departments have started to take feed back in a specified format. They analyze the feedback forms and take rational decisions to sort out the problems and complaints if any.

33. Health services

Students can avail health related benefits from students health Home, Kolkata in lie of Rs. 10/which is taken at the time of admission.

The Principal, the faculty members and the support staff section and their eligible dependants of Taki Government College can avail the utilities and the benefits of **West Bengal Health Scheme 2008.** Under this scheme Government Employees, Government Pensioners and their eligible dependent family members who are enrolled under this Scheme will be entitled to all benefits of West Bengal Health Scheme, 2008. Under this scheme Government Employees, Government Pensioners and their eligible dependent family members who are enrolled under this Scheme Government Employees, Government Pensioners and their eligible dependent family members who are enrolled under this Cashless Scheme, 2014 will be entitled to all benefits of West Bengal Health Scheme, 2008, plus the additional benefit of cashless treatment up to Rs1 lakh only.

The part time faculty members and the casual staff of Taki Government College can avail the benefits and services of **Swastha Sathi** health scheme launched by the Government of West Bengal. This health scheme provides basic health cover for secondary and tertiary diseases care up to Rs 1.5 lakh per annum through Insurance Mode and critical illness up to Rs.5lakhs through Assurance Mode. This scheme is paperless, cashless and based on smart card. It also covers the spouses and their respective parents. It has been observed that till date about 42 part time faculty and casual staff members of the College have enrolled themselves to avail this facility.

38. Placement services provided to students

The BMA Wealth Creators Ltd. is one of the biggest providers of the customised financial services in eastern India. This Particular Company have requested the Career Counselling and Placement Cell of Taki Government College through an e-mail for a long-run business tie –up where they can place the students of this College in different sectors of their organisation. They were looking for people in the posts of Tele Sales Officer in the fields of Real Estate and Insurance. About **63** candidates (college students) from both Science and Humanities departments have participated in the campus interview. These **25 candidates** were called for the Second round of interview with their credentials in their main office. Some of them were selected and were asked to join immediately but unfortunately, they were not interested to join the job then. The possible reasons cited by them for not joining the job were the Exam problem as most were 2nd year student. It was very unfortunate that the selected students did not join the job but the initial response from them was very positive. They have given a positive feedback to such an endeavour of the Career Counselling and Placement Cell and have requested the Cell to undertake such endeavours again.

39. Development programs for non-teaching staff

Non teaching staff members significantly contributed in administrative activities. Office staff Mr. Hirendra Nath Roy participated in the training program on HRMS organized by DPI, Higher Education Department, Govt. of West Bengal. He also attended in te discussion on HRMS and ISMS arranged in the SDO office Basirhat.

40. Good practices of the Institution

Keeping parity with the previous year outreach programs for public awareness were organized. Quite a few career awareness seminars and popular lectures were organized by various departments on a regular basis.

41. Linkage development with National and International, academic and Research Bodies

Some of the teaching staff of Taki Govt. College are associated with various academic and research institutes in collaborative research. Dr. Saubhik Das of Department of Botany is associated with Bose Institute, Kolkata. Dr Debashis Das of the Department of Zoology has done collaborative research on a part of his research topic, dealing with anatomy, with AIIMS, New Delhi.

42. Action taken report on the AQAR of the previous year

Different committees of social relevance like – anti-ragging Cell, Cell for gender sensitization, cell for career counseling and placement was initiated and emphasis was given to guide the students to achieve their future goal. Cultural activities were given priorities to make them fill more attached to the college that will indirectly improve the attendance. Beautification of the

college compound maintenance of the medicinal garden under the supervision of Dept. of Botany Computerization of the library with Ac reading room are some of the significant activities.
