



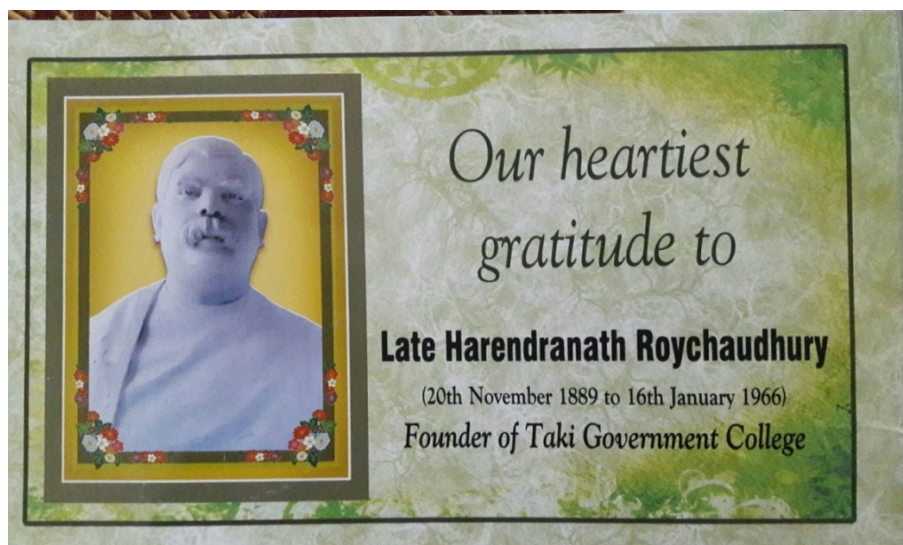

POSTGRADUATE (P.G.) PROSPECTUS

The College offers two Post Graduate Courses in Bengali and English. The Post Graduate Department of Bengali and its M.A. course were introduced in the year 2005 with the administrative approval of Higher Education Directorate, Government of West Bengal. At the time of its inception, the P.G. course was affiliated to the University of Calcutta. Since the formation of West Bengal State University in 2008, the P.G. course has been affiliated to W.B.S.U. The Post Graduate course was introduced to the English Department of Taki Government College in 2014. The Controller of Examinations of the PG Courses run by Taki Govt. College is the Officer-in-Charge of the institution.

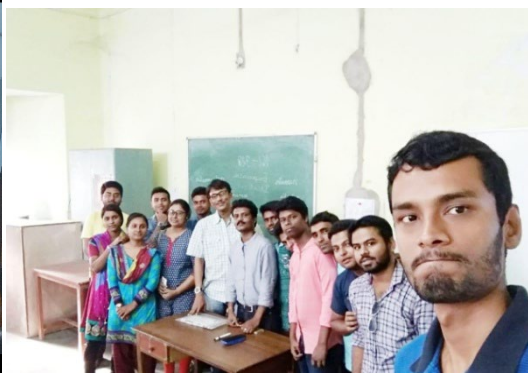

REGULATION FOR POST GRADUATE EXAMINATIONS :

Attendance of student:

The minimum percentage of attendance to qualify for appearing in the End Semester Examination shall be strictly 75 %. If the attendance is less than 75% but not below 60%, the candidate may appear for the examination with a fine (not less than 15% of the annual gross fee paid to the University by the student) as decided by the University Authority. Any discrepancy in this regard shall be referred to the Vice-Chancellor for final decision.

Evaluation:

The evaluation of the students will be carried out through – 1) Continuous evaluation/ Midterm Examination and ii) End Semester Examination:

1. Continuous evaluation/ Mid-term Examination: The concerned Department shall conduct Continuous evaluation/ Mid-term Examination for the Semesters in all the papers based

on the extent of syllabus covered up to the time.

For Continuous evaluation the mode of evaluation may include:

- Term Papers/ Reviews/ Small Research Projects/ Case Studies.
- Group Discussions
- Field Work
- Seminar Presentations
- Home Assignments
- Class Assignments/ Tests
- Dissertation, etc.

2) The marks obtained in Continuous evaluation/ Mid-term Examination for theoretical papers will comprise of 20% of the total marks in the paper concerned and will be added to the End Semester Examination marks, which will carry 80% of the total marks in the paper.

End Semester Examination

1. A student admitted to the M.A./ M.Sc./ M.Com./ M.B.M. Degree Course of Studies, having completed a regular course of studies at the Post Graduate Department of the university, may be allowed to appear for the End Semester Examination at the end of the course of each semester, subject to the conditions stipulated in the regulations and the rules as may be framed there under.

Cancellation /Discontinuation of Examination after completing one or more semester(s):

1. A student who, after undergoing a regular course of studies, appears at any semester Examination, in part, or in full, and intends to seek for cancellation of the same, may apply for the said purpose to the Controller of Examinations through the concerned Head of Department within *fifteen days* from the last date of completion of the said Examination. In such a case, the entire examination excluding the practical paper(s) (since continuous assessment) would be treated as cancelled. The candidate may be permitted to appear for the relevant semester examination afresh in the succeeding year(s) if chances remain after obtaining permission from the Controller of Examinations. However, if the candidate wants to reappear for the Practical/Continuous Assessment/Internal Examinations again he/she has to surrender his/her obtained marks and appear afresh when the course is offered later provided within prescribed chances.

2. A candidate after successfully completing one semester may opt for not continuing the next semester immediately and may join the semester subsequently when offered, subject to the permission of the appropriate authority. However, the candidate will be allowed to attend classes for any semester if he/she has not appeared for the examinations for the previous semester provided he/she has completed the internal assessments and satisfy the criteria of attendance as per the University norms ascertified by the respective HOD.

3. Subject to the fulfilment of conditions stipulated, a student who, after pursuing a regular course work, does not register himself/herself for the examination or fails to appear at the examination, or appears but fails to secure the minimum qualifying marks may be permitted to continue studies in the next semester(s) as well as to appear for his due semester(s) examinations within prescribed chances.

4. A candidate once registered for M.A./ M.Sc./ M.Com./ M.B.M. course, has to complete all four semesters within 4 years from the date of admission. The Vice-Chancellor, however, may extend the period of registration of a candidate in an extraordinary situation.

Supplementary Examination :

1. If a candidate gets 'F' in one or more paper(s), he/she shall be deemed to have failed in that/those paper(s) only and shall be required to repeat that paper/ those papers in a subsequent semester when offered. A candidate can appear a maximum number of three times to clear a particular paper,

including the regular one, failing which he/ she shall be dropped from the rolls of the University. A chance not availed by the candidate will be deemed to have lapsed.

2. The result of 4th semester examination shall be kept withheld unless a candidate has cleared all the previous semesters.

3. Candidate appearing for Supplementary Examination has to apply to the Controller of Examinations through the concerned Head of the Department two month prior to the commencement of End Semester Examination.

4. If a candidate is dropped from the University Rolls because of the failure to clear particular paper/papers, he/ she may apply for re-admission in the beginning of the next academic session along with the fresh applications.

5. There will ordinarily not be any chance of re-appearing in the Continuous evaluation/Mid-term Examination. Marks once awarded in the Continuous evaluation/ Mid-term Examination will be credited to a candidate's performance in subsequent chances, if any. However, if a candidate surrenders his/her marksheet he/she can reappear for the Continuous evaluation/ Mid-term Examination when the paper is offered in a subsequent semester provided number of chances permitting.

ADMISSION TO P.G. COURSES

Criteria for Admission in the P.G. Courses of Bengali and English:

Honours Graduates from **West Bengal State University/ UGC recognized universities** in the relevant subjects who have passed in the Current (2022) or immediately Previous Year (2020 and 2021) are eligible to apply.

Merit List will be prepared strictly in order of merit on the basis of percentage of marks obtained in the Honours subjects. Out of total seats, **80% are reserved for WBSU candidates** and rest **20% are reserved for candidates belonging to Other Universities and WBSU candidates.**

Rules and Regulations in Respect of Reserved Quota:

As per Government Norms,

- i) **For SC/ST-** 22% and 6% respectively of the total seats of the concerned subject.
- ii) **For Persons with Disability:** Reservation of 3% seats for PWD within each respective category (SC/ST, OBC-A, OBC-B, Unreserved of the concerned subject).
- iii) **For OBC-A/ OBC-B:** Implementation of reservation already started from the academic Session 2014-15 as per West Bengal Govt. Rules in a phase-wise manner.
